# By-Laws Reminder

REGARDING PARADES FROM GENERAL ORDER #1 (page 30)

- 1. Shriners Only. Notwithstanding the provisions in §335.11, in parades of temples at annual Sessions of Shriners International, unless written dispensation is received from the Imperial Potentate for the annual Session during his term in office, or in local Shriners parades or exhibitions under the auspices of temples or Shrine associations, only Nobles shall participate.
- 2. Civic Parades. In civic parades, and non-Shrine public appearances, Nobles, their ladies, children and masonic related or sponsored organizations may participate, with the approval of the Potentate. Only Nobles may perform or compete in any vehicle, ride vehicles with fewer than four wheels, or operate any vehicle while parading, including participation with any of the clubs or units parading. In those situations, where a specific license is required by a state, due to the size, weight or passenger carrying capacity of a vehicle to be used in a parade, and should there be NO MEMBER NOBLE PROPERLY LICENSED TO OPERATE SAID VEHICLE, the temple may hire a properly licensed driver with proof of the proper license required, and verifying that the driver has an acceptable driving record according to any applicable insurance carrier(s). This driver MUST be added to the insurance policy, and accepted by the insurance company, PRIOR to his/her operating ANY vehicle on behalf of the temple.
- Musical Groups.In civic parades and functions, Shrine musical groups may, with the approval of the Potentate, allow guest musicians to participate. The guest must be significantly and substantially distinguished from the Nobles in dress.
- 4. Regulations.Shrine Parade Regulations 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12 and 14 apply to civic parades as well.



Illustrious Sirs, nobles, and brothers all,

I was just in OG training last year. If it were a perfect world, I would be H&P this year, but as you know things happen. We adjust, refocus, and move forward. I sit here one week out from my Assist Rabban training in Tampa reflecting on Shrinedom.

The two trainings were incredibly valuable. In the last two years I have been fed a lot of data, some might say it's like drinking from a firehose. These conferences are setup to accomplish many things. I will list them in no particular order and at a very high-level as it would be impossible to do otherwise without writing an essay and who wants to read that.

- 1. Building relationships- you're not only meeting leaders and nobles from other temples, but you are building a support structure. Your establishing relationships with your leadership and peer groups across the shrine. Folks you can use as a shoulder to lean on and get advice from.
- 2. You're learning what other temples are doing. You're discussing their fund raising, their events, clubs, their successes, and their failures. Your able to have conversations to understand what might be good at our temple and what won't work because of temple cultures or not having a physical building. What may work at one temple may not work at another. We may not be able to purchase a building at this time, but we can nurture a culture that will contribute to our future success.
- 3. Your introduced to the Imperial Sirs, their ladies and the support staff you are reaching out to as things come up and they do come up. They are a wealth of knowledge and its easier to reach out when you have met them and its clear they have genuine concern for our shared philanthropy and for our success.
- 4. Education on the priorities of running a temple to include business and working with various audiences. This will include purpose, attitude, people, planning and performance.
- 5. You're hearing and motivated by the latest hospital and clinical programs. You're hearing from patient ambassadors or several of countless stories of the impacts we have on so many lives. You leave energized and reminded why we do what we do.
- 6. Noble programs, to include things like Shrine law, budgeting, mitigating temple risk, fund raising and marketing.
- 7. The ladies were also included and had their program breakouts. They are a very valuable asset and many times not well utilized.

Our success will not rest on any single set of shoulders or even the divan. I believe our clubs and units are our lifeline into our Shriner Center and our representatives in our blue lodges. I believe we need the following to succeed. Again, not any specific order.

- 1. We need good relations between our district blue lodges and the shrine clubs. This should include joint socials and a combined efforts for fund raising. 3. We need to reestablish a culture with our masonic foundation. We are surrounded by good men. We need to help each other to succeed.

- 4. We require active shrine clubs and units finding new ways to have fun. Again, I think this is at a district level. These events are where we bring the men from our various lodges, their ladies and masonic seekers.
- 5. We need to have a strong community presence. With that, we need better marketing expertise. We are very behind with our various social media visibility. We are not looking to recruit, but our community should know who we are. If they don't know who we are, then how will we build blue lodges and ultimately all the incumbent bodies like Shrine. Men need to know who and what we represent before they can petition us.

We each have our own story for why we are a Shriner. My masonic path started with "Be a Shriner now", from there, I was introduced to Freemasonry. I didn't know I was missing that in my life until I found it. Blue lodge, Scottish Rite and Shrine etc.., all very different and each bringing something unique.
